The Board will review and may form positions for 2022 Legislative Session bills and resolutions related to the practice of psychology. The Executive Officer will also report on the status of bills.

a) SB2281 - RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGY

Establishes interim licensure requirements for school psychologists to be administered by the Board of Psychology. Requires all school psychologists to be licensed by January 1, 2023. Increases the composition of the Board of Psychology to include two school psychologists. Requires the Board of Psychology and the Department of Education to collaborate to determine a permanent licensing scheme for school psychologists in the State and to submit a report of their findings and recommendations to the Legislature. (SD2)
