We request submission of written testimony at least 24-hours prior to the start

of the meeting to ensure that it can be distributed to Board Members. Written testimony will only be accepted for the items listed on the meeting agenda. Written public testimony submitted will be treated as public record and any contact information contained therein may be available for public inspection and copying.

Internet Access

To view the meeting and provide live oral testimony, please use the Zoom link at the top of the agenda. You will be asked to enter your name. The Board requests that you enter your full name, but you may use a pseudonym or other identifier if you wish to remain anonymous. You will also be asked for an email address. You may fill in this field with any entry in an email format, e.g., *****@***mail.com.

Your microphone will be automatically muted. When the Board asks for public testimony, you may click the Raise Hand button found on your Zoom screen to indicate that you wish to testify about the agenda item. The Board will individually enable each testifier to unmute their microphone. When recognized by the Board, please unmute your microphone before speaking and mute your microphone after you finish speaking.

Upon request, your Zoom video or similar on-camera option will be enabled to allow you to be visible to the Board members and other meeting participants while presenting oral testimony. Please turn off your camera after you conclude your testimony. It is the individual testifier's responsibility to ensure they have the video and internet capabilities to successfully stream or remotely testify. The Board maintains the authority to remove and block individuals who willfully disrupt or compromise the conduct of the meeting.

II. Discussion and decision-making regarding the contract to retain business entity Aon Re, Inc. ("Aon") as a consultant pursuant to the Request for Proposal ("RFP") dated November 8, 2024, to assist the HHRF restart operations and stabilize Hawaii's property insurance market.

The HHRF may convene an executive session pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") section 92-5(a)(4) to consult with the HHRF's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the HHRF's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities.

- A. Discussion regarding the proposed terms and conditions of the contract to retain Aon as a consultant pursuant to the RFP;
- B. Approval of the contract to retain Aon as a consultant pursuant to the RFP; and
- C. Designation of an authorized representative for further negotiations on the contract to retain Aon as a consultant pursuant to the RFP, if necessary.

III. Status report from Permitted Interaction Group (PIG) created for the purpose of discussing and reviewing sensitive, proprietary information with Aon to streamline and refine recommendations to the Board.

- A. The PIG will provide a progress update regarding its review of proprietary information received from Aon and the process for refining Aon's recommendations.

IV. Status updates from Aon regarding deliverables under the RFP.

- A. Status of market assessment and recommendations to the Board;
- B. Timeline of other deliverables under the RFP (operational setup, sourcing insurance and reinsurance capacity, and brokerage administration).

- V. Discussion and decision-making on Board testimony for Legislative bills from the 2025 Legislative session on the following measures:

The HHRF may convene an executive session pursuant to HRS 92-5(a)(4) to consult with the HHRF's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the HHRF's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities.

- A. [HB426](#) / [SB1044](#) - RELATING TO THE STABILIZATION OF PROPERTY INSURANCE. Expands the powers of the Hawai'i Property Insurance Association and reactivates the Hawai'i Hurricane Relief Fund to help to stabilize the property insurance market in the State. Requires the Insurance Commissioner to conduct a study. Appropriates moneys.
- B. [SB805](#) - RELATING TO CONDOMINIUM INSURANCE. Establishes the Hawai'i Condominium Mutual Insurance Company to provide property and casualty insurance to high-rise residential condominium properties and the owners of those units. Establishes a loan fund to assist associations of apartment owners experiencing increased insurance costs. Appropriates moneys.
- C. [SB804](#) - RELATING TO INSURANCE FOR HAWAII CONDOMINIUM PROPERTIES. Requires property insurers to offer discounts on a condominium association's annual insurance premium if the association adopts specific risk mitigation upgrades or develops comprehensive disaster response plans. Requires property insurers of condominiums to base premium increases on actuarial justifications that reflect actual risk reduction resulting from upgraded fire safety improvements installed in conjunction with a building fire and life safety evaluation. Requires property insurers of condominiums to justify premium increases above 10%. Requires property insurers of condominiums to publicly report premium increases each year.
- D. [HB1057](#) / [SB1376](#) - RELATING TO THE STABILIZATION OF PROPERTY INSURANCE. Expands the powers of the Hawai'i Property Insurance Association and Hawai'i Hurricane Relief Fund to help to stabilize the property insurance market in the State. Requires the Insurance Commissioner to conduct a study. Appropriates moneys.
- E. [SB1167](#) - RELATING TO THE HAWAII HURRICANE RELIEF FUND. Requires the plan of operation for the Hawai'i hurricane relief fund to include the filing and litigation of subrogation claims against responsible parties for claims paid by the fund for losses attributable to climate

change. Requires insurance rates for the fund to account for proceeds paid to the fund from subrogation claims.
